Currently, the security sector directly employs 145,000 people in the UK, delivering high value jobs for a highly skilled workforce, and supports 5,800 apprentices across the sector. The UK is the third largest security exporter worldwide and is facing a huge skills shortage. Government, industry, and academia are working to address skills shortages by developing opportunities to develop skills needed by the sector.

### The Security Skills Board – Promoting private security skills.

The Security Skills Board is a cross-industry group of large and small employers that is focused on driving change and improving the number of people coming into and staying in private security. They champion capability and career development and are working hard to clarify the skills, attitudes and knowledge needed to succeed and grow within the industry.

Their long-term goal is to create a National Skills Academy by 2025. The academy will feature a digital web-based industry profession map which will highlight specific transferable skills, career pathways and opportunities to access quality assured training, professional development, and education for growth.

The NSA will be an industry point of contact for anyone interested in knowing more about working in private security and will be accessible to all. It will promote inclusive industry standards and good practice beyond license-linked training and will support employers so that they can develop their brands, to help them attract, develop, and retain talented people.
